

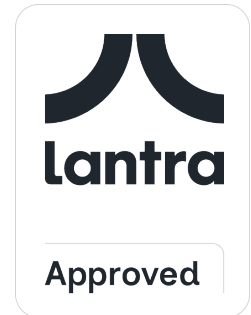
National Highways Sector Scheme Training 12A Traffic Safety & Control Officer / Traffic Safety Supervisor

Duration:

Two Days.

Group Size:

Maximum 8 delegates.

**Who Should Attend?**

Anyone working on high-speed (50mph+) dual carriageways and motorways as a Traffic Safety and Control Officer / Traffic Safety Supervisor.

Course Aims:

On successful completion of the course candidates will be able to demonstrate that they have:

- a minimum satisfactory level of knowledge of the TSCO / TSS role.
- a comprehensive awareness of the TSCO's / TSS's responsibilities
- a detailed level of knowledge of Temporary Traffic Management standards.

Pre-requisites:

To be registered as a Traffic Safety and Control Officer you must:

- Hold a valid NHSS12a Foreman certificate or card.
- Hold a valid 3-day First Aid at Work certificate in accordance with the H&S (First Aid) Regulations 1981.
- Hold a minimum of a Level 2 safety awareness training course award issued by IOSH, NEBOSH or CITB (see note below).
- Hold a valid TSCO / TSS certificate.

NB: In accordance with the NHSS12AB sector scheme requirements, from 1st September 2021 the safety awareness training course may be one of the following:

- IOSH – Managing Safely – with date of issue no longer than 5 years
- IOSH - Directing Safely – with date of issue no longer than 5 years
- CITB - Site Management Safety Training Scheme (SMSTS)
- CITB – Site Supervisors Safety Training Scheme (SSSTS)
- NeBOSH – General Certificate in Occupational Safety and Health
- NeBOSH – Certificate in Construction Health and Safety
- NeBOSH – International general certificate in Occupational Safety and Health
- NeBOSH – National Diploma in Occupational Safety and Health
- NeBOSH – International Diploma in Occupational Safety and Health

To be registered as a Traffic Safety Supervisor (from September 2025) you must also : *(See Raising the Bar 29 Appendix 3 below)*

- Hold a valid Conflict Management Training qualification.
- Hold a valid Safety Critical Medical.
- Hold a valid NHSS12 D M6 or M7 qualification.
- Hold a valid CSCS Manager in a category relevant to Highways or one issued by LANTRA.
- Should hold a valid DBS Check
- Should hold a valid NHSS 12C Supervisor or NHSS 12C Planning Officer Qualification

- Winter Maintenance

Certification:

Upon successful completion candidates will be issued with a NHSS12 Traffic Safety & Control Officer / Traffic Safety Supervisor Certificate (valid for 2 years).

A full NHSS12A Traffic Safety and Control Officer will be issued upon presentation of all the required certificates detailed in the pre-requisites. (Valid for 5 years)
